## This Message Is From an Untrusted Sender

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I live at 582 Juan Anasco Dr. We are a new build (so home ground level up at 10') along with a new Sea Wall (about 2' higher than our neighbors).

I made two key observations:

- We have two drains basically across from each other on Juan Anasco. Both drains were totally clogged with debris see attached pics. This debris clog is causing much of the problem. Just this last week we had that hard rain Saturday night and our entire street was flooded again with water up to my neighbor's front door. This was NOT due to storm surge, this was due to the clogged drain.
- A neighbor on one side of me does not have a sea wall. Her yard is low enough that the storm surge during Debby breached her backyard and was flowing like a river into the street flooding at least our entire end of the street. The lack of any protection in her back yard was a major if not sole contributor to our flooding and ultimately in my front yard. I feel that needs to be addressed. Nothing you do on our streets will prevent us from flooding as it all comes from her back and pushes forward and ultimately breaches into my yard and certainly her neighbor on the other side.

1. How deep was the water in your house? Water made it ½ way up our driveway. Made it over the front door of our neighbor across the street.

2. How deep was it in your garage? No garage damage as we're built up being a new build.

3. How long was water over the road in front of your driveway? About 1' to 2' – there is no way I could drive in it. It was build up for over 24 hours.

4. If you used sandbags or a flood barrier, and water did not enter the house, how high was the water above the level of your floors? n/a

5. If water did not enter the house or garage, how close did it get, and how deep was it in the yard at the deepest point? 8" at deepest point in yard down near street.
