

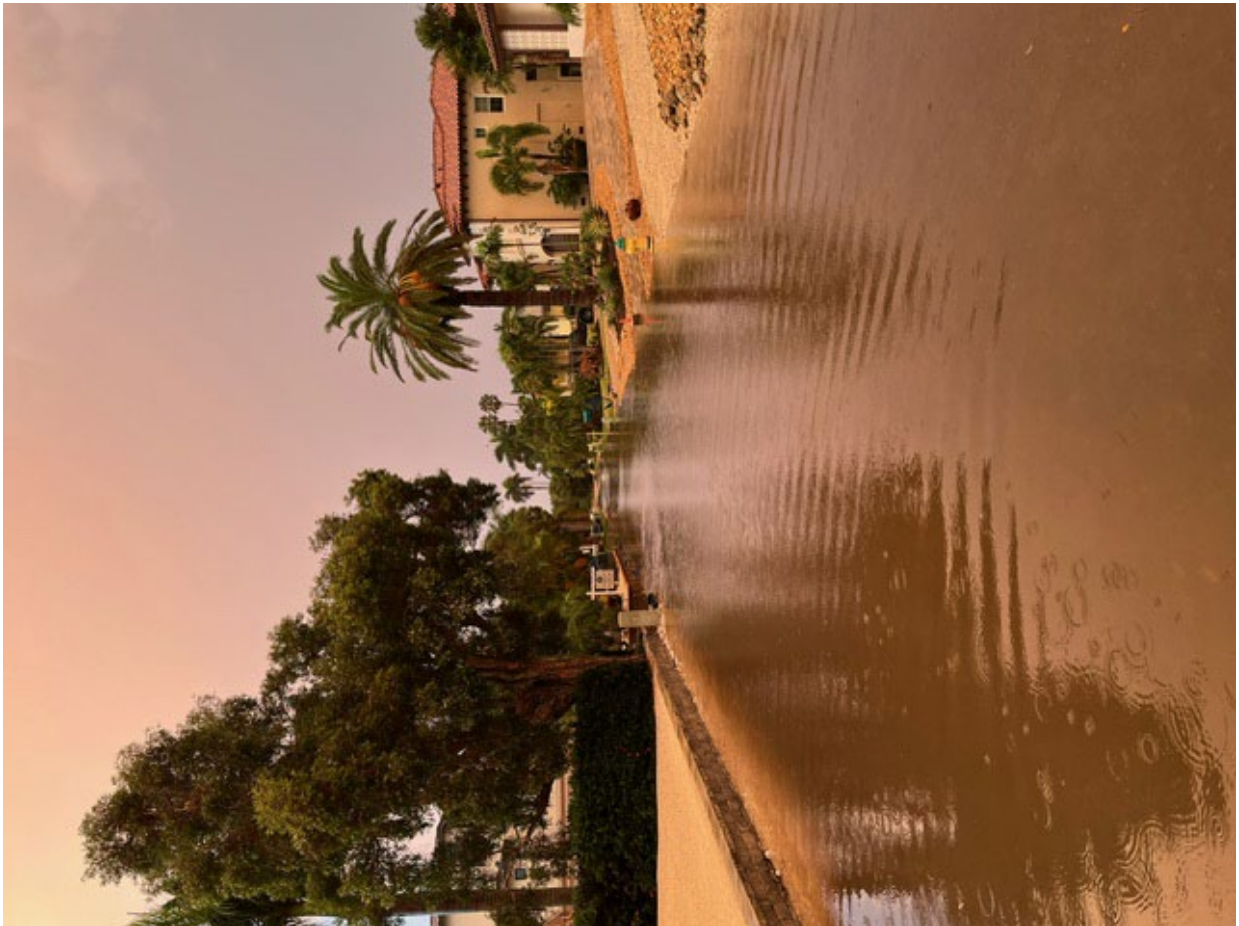

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Yesterday it was like this for about 2 hours. The entire road (from General Harris) was impassible.

A lot depends on how long it rains and how high the tide is. Yesterday the tide was quite low, but we got 3" of rain in a short period of time. Add to that the debris that clogs the grate, so that slows down the drainage. The water was over a foot deep, but I am reluctant to wade through the water in a thunderstorm to clear the grate.

Yes, this was from Aug 20.

The nearby construction sites cause debris to flow to the storm grates and they get clogged, so nothing drains. During very high tides, water comes out of the drain and floods the street. I've asked that to mitigate both of these issues, some type of "fence" be placed around the drain.....it would only need to be, maybe, 2", but enough to contain the tide water and enough to stop the debris? This would be a stop-gap fix until the road is raised and wouldn't cost much. Could we have a discussion about this?
