1. How deep was the water in your house?

The water did not get into our home with Debby due to added sandbag and other steps we took.

However, we have had 3 serious flood incidences in the past 3 years with more than a foot of water inside our home.

2. How deep was it in your garage?

N/A

3. How long was water over the road in front of your driveway?

The water from the roadway drains into our front yard, due to the slope of the roadway and our yard.

IDEALLY, it would be nice if the city could create some sort of edge/berm that we could drive over, but that would direct the water towards the bay and not directly into our yard.

4. If you used sandbags or a flood barrier, and water did not enter the house, how high was the water above the level of your floors?

For Debby, the water was approximately 6" above the floors, for other storms it has gotten as high as 2-3 feet.

5. If water did not enter the house or garage, how close did it get, and how deep was it in the yard at the deepest point?

It was at least 12 inches deep at the highest points.

I was asked to forward this information to you.

We do have photos from every flood event we have had, if needed.
