We hope this message finds you safe and well. The Town is currently gathering information related to flood damages from Hurricane Debby as part of our grant application efforts. If you were affected, we strongly urge you to share your experience with us. Without your documentation, critical projects to reduce future flooding on your street may not be possible.

Please assist us by answering the following questions:

- 1. How deep was the water in your house? None
- 2. How deep was it in your garage? None
- 3. How long was water over the road in front of your driveway? About 6-8 hours then it receded, probably due to tide and wind direction
- 4. If you used sandbags or a flood barrier, and water did not enter the house, how high was the water above the level of your floors? No water entered house
- 5. If water did not enter the house or garage, how close did it get, and how deep was it in the yard at the deepest point? The water entered our driveway, about 10-15 feet. The driveway gradually raises about 12"-18" above the street level.
